

HOW TO MAKE A STUFFED KONG

As pet owners, it is our responsibility to make our animals lives as enriched and fulfilled as possible. The average suburban dog will spend 8+ hours of their day sleeping while their owners are at work. This can lead to boredom and problematic behaviours such as chewing, digging in the yard and many more.

A simple way we can relieve our dogs of boredom is by providing them with enrichment. Enrichment can come in many forms ranging from puzzle toys, homemade food dispensing toys, or something as simple as scattering your dog's kibble in the snow or grass. All these options provide our dogs with mental stimulation to challenge their minds and engage the senses.

A good way to make sure your dog gets enrichment every day is to make stuffed frozen food dispensing toys in advance. Depending on how many food dispensing toys you have, this only takes about 30 minutes of your time, once a week!

On page 2, are some easy to follow steps on how to make frozen food dispensing toys for your dog by using your dog's kibble as well as other tasty food items!

Directions




Start with your dog's favourite treats. This is a great opportunity to use up all those treat crumbs at the bottom of the bag! If you don't have enough crumbs, then start breaking some treats up into small pieces and place them in a strainer.



Shake the strainer over a bowl until all of the treat crumbs are in the bowl.



Measure 4 cups of water (you can also use chicken or beef broth with no onions to add more flavour) and place it in the microwave for about 4 minutes.





Combine the measured kibble with the treat crumbs into the bowl. Take the water (chicken or beef broth- **with no onions**) from the microwave and place it in the bowl. At this point you could add in any other food items your dog likes such as yogurt, honey, or pieces of vegetables (such as carrots).

Cover the entire bowl with tin foil – this keeps the heat in so the kibble can soak up all the moisture. Let it sit for about 1-2 hours – mixing the contents from time to time so that the food absorbs all of the moisture.



After letting the kibble absorb the liquid, take a fork and mix the kibble. It should be quite soft and mushy



Stuff your food dispensing toys with the mushed kibble and then place it in the freezer. You can also top the toys off with anything spreadable such as peanut butter, yogurt or cheez whiz!

Give a stuffed frozen toy to your dog for their breakfast, dinner or as a special treat!
